What are the Advantages of Using a No-till System?

Many producers find that no-till production systems help them save time, conserve moisture, and reduce erosion.

There are many potential economic advantages for utilizing no-till systems which include: 1) lower fuel costs due to fewer trips over the field, 2) reducing the amount of tillage equipment needed, which results in lower machinery investment, 3) lower labor requirements, which reduce hired labor costs or free up operator time for other farm operations, 4) reducing soil loss from water and wind erosion, and 5) conserving soil moisture.

Herbicides are something that most no-till producers rely on heavily. Managing weeds in no-till systems requires good planning and thought. Through planning, successful no-till producers can anticipate potential problems, resolve the problems, and make use of other means of weed suppression using other techniques
